What Is Baptism?

Baptism is a ceremony when the church leaders use water as a symbol that you are made clean by Jesus Christ and have received the Holy Spirit. The water is just a symbol of what Jesus has already done in your life. John, who used water to baptize many people, made this clear.

Luke 3 ¹⁶John answered them all, "I baptize you with water. But one more powerful than I will come, the thongs of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire.

Peter talks about water being a symbol of what Christ does for you.

1 Peter 3 ²¹and this water symbolizes baptism that now saves you also-not the removal of dirt from the body but the pledge of a good conscience toward God. It saves you by the resurrection of Jesus Christ, ²²who has gone into heaven and is at God's right hand - with angels, authorities and powers in submission to him.

You should ask the church leaders to baptize you, to say to the world that you follow Jesus Christ. Ask them if you can say a few words first, to explain what has happened to you and how you intend to follow Jesus. In the baptism ceremony they will ask you to come forward and confess your decision to follow Jesus. They will then take you through a brief ceremony using water to symbolize your cleansing and new life.

Titus 3 ⁴But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, ⁵he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, ⁶whom he poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior.

¹⁴And God said, "Let there be lights in the expanse of the sky to separate the day from the night, and let them serve as signs to mark seasons and days and years, ¹⁵and let them be lights in the expanse of the sky to give light on the earth." And it was so. ¹⁶God made two great lights--the greater light to govern the day and the lesser light to govern the night. He also made the stars. ¹⁷God set them in the expanse of the sky to give light on the earth, ¹⁸to govern the day and the night, and to separate light from darkness. And God saw that it was good. ¹⁹And there was evening, and there was morning--the fourth day.

²⁰And God said, "Let the water teem with living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the expanse of the sky." ²¹So God created the great creatures of the sea and every living and moving thing with which the water teems, according to their kinds, and every winged bird according to its kind. And God saw that it was good.

²²God blessed them and said, "Be fruitful and increase in number and fill the water in the seas, and let the birds increase on the earth." ²³And there was evening, and there was morning--the fifth day.

²⁴And God said, "Let the land produce living creatures according to their kinds: livestock, creatures that move along the ground, and wild animals, each according to its kind." And it was so. ²⁵God made the wild animals according to their kinds, the livestock according to their kinds, and all the creatures that move along the ground according to their kinds. And God saw that it was good. ²⁶Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, in our likeness, and let them rule over the fish of the sea and the birds of the air, over the livestock, over all the earth, and over all the creatures that move along the ground."

²⁷So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them. ²⁸God blessed them and said to them, "Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it. Rule over the fish of the sea and the birds of the air and over every living creature that moves on the ground."

1 Peter 4 ¹²Dear friends, do not be surprised at the painful trial you are suffering, as though something strange were happening to you. ¹³But rejoice that you participate in the sufferings of Christ, so that you may be overjoyed when his glory is revealed. ¹⁴If you are insulted because of the name of Christ, you are blessed, for the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you. ¹⁵If you suffer, it should not be as a murderer or thief or any other kind of criminal, or even as a meddler. ¹⁶However, if you suffer as a Christian, do not be ashamed, but praise God that you bear that name. ¹⁷For it is time for judgment to begin with the family of God; and if it begins with us, what will the outcome be for those who do not obey the gospel of God? ¹⁸And, "If it is hard for the righteous to be saved, what will become of the ungodly and the sinner?" ¹⁹So then, those who suffer according to God's will should commit themselves to their faithful Creator and continue to do good.

God Tells Us To Choose

Luke 9 ²⁶If anyone is ashamed of me and my words, the Son of Man will be ashamed of him when he comes in his glory and in the glory of the Father and of the holy angels.

Romans 10 ⁹If you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved. ¹¹As the Scripture says, "Anyone who trusts in him will never be put to shame."

God's Solution to The World's Problems

The world has many problems today because we rebelled against the Creator. There are sinful men and evil spirits. There is sickness, suffering and death. This should not surprise us though, because the world is rebelling against the one true God.

God has provided us with a way to be forgiven and he gives us new life through his Holy Spirit. However, what should he do with the evil spirits, the corruption and the suffering in this world? Should he try to fix up every problem? No! That wouldn't work because there would still be sinful men and evil spirits, creating more suffering.

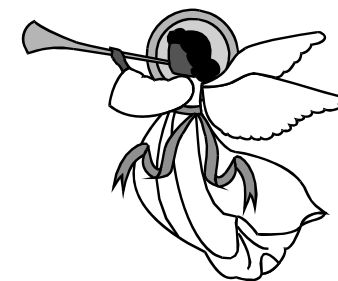

Evil Spirits Come Into the World

Suddenly evil spirits appeared in the world. Some think that evil spirits were angels who rebelled against God following a powerful angel named Lucifer. Lucifer did not want to serve God; he wanted to be equal with God.

Ezekiel 28 ¹³You were in Eden, the garden of God; every precious stone adorned you: ruby, topaz and emerald, chrysolite, onyx and jasper, sapphire, turquoise and beryl. Your settings and mountings were made of gold; on the day you were created they were prepared. ¹⁴You were anointed as a guardian cherub, for so I ordained you. You were on the holy mount of God; you walked among the fiery stones. ¹⁵You were blameless in your ways from the day you were created till wickedness was found in you. ¹⁶Through your widespread trade you were filled with violence, and you sinned. So I drove you in disgrace from the mount of God, and I expelled you, O guardian cherub, from among the fiery stones. ¹⁷Your heart became proud on account of your beauty, and you corrupted your wisdom because of your splendor. So I threw you to the earth;

Isaiah 14 ¹²How you have fallen from heaven, O morning star (Lucifer), son of the dawn! You have been cast down to the earth, you who once laid low the nations! ¹³You said in your heart, "I will ascend to heaven; I will raise my throne above the stars of God; I will sit enthroned on the mount of assembly, on the utmost heights of the sacred mountain. ¹⁴I will ascend above the tops of the clouds; I will make myself like the Most High." ¹⁵But you are brought down to the grave, to the depths of the pit.

The Bible suggests that Lucifer (or Satan) convinced some angels to follow him.

Revelation 12 ⁷And there was war in heaven. Michael and his angels fought against the dragon, and the dragon and his angels fought back. ⁸But he was not strong enough, and they lost their place in heaven. ⁹The great dragon was hurled down—that ancient

Why was this a difficult case then? It was difficult because the woman was the judge's own daughter. More than that, he knew that she did not have the money to pay the fine, so she would have to go to jail. The judge loved his daughter and did not want to send her to jail, but he was a fair judge and he could not ignore her crime.

What would you have done? Here is what the judge did. He decided that she was guilty and he sentenced her to a heavy fine. She left the courtroom very sad because she knew she would go to jail. But... after she had left the courtroom, the judge stood up and took off his black robe. He then went and stood beside her in the courthouse and he took out his own wallet and paid the fine for her. He was a fair judge, but he also loved his daughter.

That is what God did for us. He had to give punishment for our sins, but he loved us very much. So he came to earth and took our punishment for us. When he died, he was paying for our sins.

1 Peter 2 ²⁴He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, so that we might die to sins and live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. ²⁵For you were like sheep going astray, but now you have returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls.

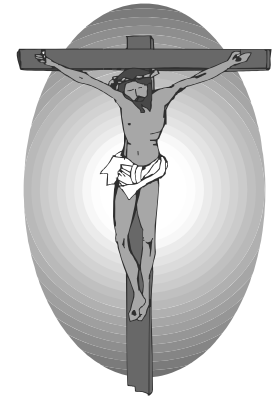

All of our lives we have been told lies by this evil spirit, called Satan. He does not want us to know God or to know about God.
